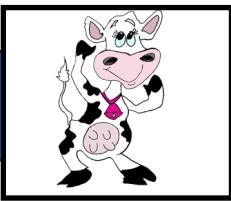

- ◆ The Platteville Dairy Days Goat Show is open to youth no more than 21 years old as of January 1 of the show year. There are NO geographical limitations for goat show exhibitors. Membership in 4-H, FFA or breed association is NOT required.
- ◆ In addition to the \$5.00 exhibitor fee, there will be a \$1.00/head entry fee.
- ◆ Only (1) animal may be entered under each lot number.
- ◆ Premise ID and individual animal ID must be listed on the entry form.
- ◆ All goats must be identified with official scrapie ear tags, other official scrapie identification or registration tattoos. All goats that are tattooed must have a copy of registration paperwork available at check-in. All official ID must be in ear or approved location.
- ◆ Goats must be in place by 11:00 am with the show starting at 12:00 (Noon) on Sunday, September 8, 2024. Goats will be released at 4:00 p.m.
- ◆ There is no electricity or wash racks available. There will be drinking water available for the animals.
- ◆ Pens will be available this year, however, exhibitors may bring their own pens or kennels or show from their own trailers. IF YOU CHOOSE TO SHOW FROM YOUR TRAILER, YOU MUST BE AT THE SHOW RING PROMPTLY AND NOT DELAY THE SHOW.
- ◆ Goats with natural horns may not be entered.
- ◆ All does over 24 months must have kidded to be shown.
- ◆ Any inappropriate actions, as determined by Dairy Days Committee, toward your animal may result in disqualification.
- ◆ No person shall exhibit any animal afflicted with or exposed to any contagious or infectious disease.

- ◆ Danish System judging will be used for breed classes.
- ◆ Definitions of Ages:
 - Junior doe kid; Born April 1—June 1 of exhibit year
 - Senior doe kid; Born January 1—March 31 of exhibit year
 - Junior yearling doe; Born September 1—December 31 of year prior to show year
 - Senior yearling doe; 12-24 months old, not in milk
 - Yearling milkers; under 2 years old, in milk
 - Junior milkers; at least 2 years old, but under 3 years old, in milk
 - Mature milkers; at least 3 years old, but under 5 years old,
 - Aged milkers; 5 years old and older

Department 06-Junior Mechanical Projects

- ◆ This department is open to Juniors only.
- ◆ Exhibitors may not enter both Junior and Open Classes.
- ◆ Limit of one entry per lot number.
- ◆ No names shall be printed on exhibits.
- ◆ Danish System of judging will be used.
- ◆ Maximum of 3'x4' table space will be allowed for displays.
- ◆ Exhibitors are able to enter with a partner for this department. Both exhibitors must be in the same grade class. Only one exhibitor needs to enter the project on the entry form. List your partner's name in the description section of the entry form.
- ◆ All Lego, K'nex and Scale Model exhibits MUST be in a box or on a lid or cookie sheet that is proportional to the project for ease in handling and displaying. No larger than 2'x3' please.
- ◆ The largest scale to be used is 1/12 (1 inch equals 1 foot).
- ◆ Motorized items must include batteries and instructions for use.
- ◆ All kit built exhibits must include model instructions.
